## 7 Handling and Storage

- **Handling**

- **Precautions for safe handling:**

Ensure good ventilation/exhaustion at the workplace.

Do not attempt to adjust, repair or in any other way modify the cylinders containing this gas mixture. If there is a malfunction or another type of operational problem, contact nearest distributor immediately.
